Application *for* Full-Time Undergraduate Admission & Scholarships

Application Instructions

This application may be used by all undergraduates seeking full-time admission to Capitol Technology University.

Deadline

There is no deadline for application for admission. Capitol Technology University has a rolling admission policy.

Step 1. Application

Complete and sign the application for undergraduate admission (pages 3 and 4). Incomplete applications will be returned. The application is also available online at www.CapTechU.edu.

Step 2. Application Fee

Include a \$25 check or money order made payable to Capitol Technology University. The application fee is non-refundable.

Step 3. Student Essay

On a separate sheet of paper, write a comprehensive essay that explains your desire to attend Capitol Technology University along with your plans and ambitions for the future. You may also provide any additional information about yourself, such as high school awards, interests and community service activities. Your double-spaced essay should not exceed two typewritten pages.

Step 4. Submitting Your Application Mail your:

- completed application
- □ \$25 application fee
- □ student essay

Step 5. Transcripts

Compete the attached high school transcript request and evaluation sheet (page 5) and submit it to your high school guidance counselor. GED diploma recipients must provide copies of their GED test scores. The transfer applicant is required to submit an official high school transcript as well as an official transcript from each college attended.

Step 6. SAT/ACT Scores

If you have not taken the SAT or ACT, register to do so with your high school (not applicable to transfer students, high school graduates who have been out of school for five or more years, and high school GED diploma recipients). Foreign students from non-English speaking countries must submit TOEFL scores.

Step 7. Financial Aid Worksheet

To be considered for all scholarships and institutional financial aid, you must also complete the financial aid estimator worksheet. Priority deadline for scholarships is March 1.

Important Information

Admissions Requirements

Applicants must have a certificate or diploma from an accredited four year school or senior high school. It is recommended that students seeking admission to the college follow the College Preparatory Course in high school. However, the college will consider applicants who have satisfied high school graduation requirements under the General Education Development (GED) test.

Admission is granted on the basis of grades, class rank, test scores, and other evidence, including the recommendations of appropriate high school officials, which indicate the ability to complete a course of study leading to a degree.

Applicants must give evidence of having maintained a satisfactory high school record; I.e., a high school average of "C" (minimum) in academic work and 16 acceptable course units distributed as follows:

English Grammar/Composition

and Literature 4 units

Mathematics Three courses in Algebra,

Algebra II and a course in

Geometry 3 units

History and/or American Civilization,

Social Studies U.S. History, World Civilization

or African-American History 2 units

Science Course with a laboratory 3 units

The test to be used for admission purposes shall be the SAT or ACT. Scores from tests taken in December or January of the senior year of secondary school are preferred. Results of tests completed during the junior year are acceptable. Foreign Students: The college will consider foreign students whose transcripts are cleared by the Office of Admissions and who have satisfactory scores on the TOEFL Examination. Students desiring to enter the college should have official copies of their transcripts forwarded to the admissions office early in the year preceding the semester in which they desire to enter. Furthermore, foreign students are totally responsible for their financial obligations.

Capitol Technology University in Brief

Location: Capitol Technology University is located in Laurel, Maryland, midway between Washington, DC and Baltimore. Just off the Baltimore-Washington Parkway, the campus is near NASA Goddard Space Flight Center, the Beltsville Agricultural Research Center of the U.S. Department of Agriculture and Patuxent Wildlife Research Center. Capitol Technology University occupies the site of the former Beltsville Speedway.

Campus: The 52-acre Laurel campus consists of academic buildings and residential halls, all in a green, suburban environment. The academic halls are connected by glass-enclosed pedestrian walkways. The residential halls are apartment-style. Parking is free and readily available.

Academic Character: Capitol Technology University fills a unique niche through a program that integrates scientific theory with hands-on experience. The curriculum is designed so students gain practical knowledge, ensuring they are immediately prepared for their professional careers. All undergraduate programs are enriched by liberal arts courses that provide every student with an enhanced sense of self and society. The college has been designated a Center of Academic Excellence in Information Assurance by the National Security Agency and Deparment of Homeland Security and operates the Space Operations Institute as a partnership with NASA.

Student Enrollment: Capitol Technology University's undergraduate students come from 11 states and 10 foreign countries, ranging in age from 17 to 59. Forty-two percent of Capitol undergraduates are ethnic and racial minorities.

Faculty and Staff: As scholarly practitioners, Capitol Technology University's faculty members are recognized in their fields and are well-connected to the industry. With small classes and a 12:1 student-to-faculty ratio, students can interact closely with instructors. Students get individualized attention early and often.

Programs of Study: Capitol Technology University offers a bachelor of science degree in 12 undergraduate areas of study and six master's degrees. All majors are in the areas of engineering, computer sciences, information technologies and business. All of the master's degrees are available online using software that delivers live, real-time audio lectures.

Student Activities: The college organizes a range of activities, such as barbecues, coffee houses, casino nights, spring fling and "see it before you rent it" movies. Students can participate is a variety of clubs: IEEE, National Society of Black Engineers, the Society of Women Engineers, intramural sports and honor societies.

Residence Life: Apartment-style student housing is available for up to 120 students. Each single-sex apartment has four bedrooms (two singles and two doubles), one bathroom and a combined living, dining and kitchen area. The apartments, 1400 square feet in size, are fully furnished with kitchen appliances such as an electric range, refrigerator/freezer, dishwasher and garbage disposal.

Accreditation: Capitol Technology University is regionally accredited by the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. Academic programs are approved by ABET, the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) and the International Assembly for Collegiate Business Education (IACBE).
