HOUSING INFORMATION

Housing is available for fall applicants who meet the following requirements:

- 1. Apply and be accepted to the college by March 15.
- 2. Complete and submit the housing application by April 1 (no exceptions).
- Submit \$200 housing deposit by May 1 (no exceptions). The deposit is refundable \_ through June 1, so the college strongly recommends you apply for your visa as soon as you receive your college acceptance.

#### INSTRUCTIONS

International students must meet the following academic and financial requirements to be considered for admission to the college.

#### Academic Requirements

- a. Certified transcripts (with English translations) of secondary school and/or college records, or examination results when periodic grades are not used for measurement purposes.
  - b. Students with prior college/university coursework wishing to transfer credits must submit an official credential evaluation from an approved credential evaluation service such as World Education Services (www.wes.org). A full list of approved evaluators can be found at www.naces.org.
- 2. Undergraduate applicants should possess two years of college preparatory mathematics, such as algebra, geometry and trigonometry.
- 3. English proficiency for direct admission into a degree program:
  - TOEFL paper-based test score of 550 or computer-based test score of 213 or Internet-based score of 80, or
  - b. Proof of completing a specified level of proficiency at an English language school, or
  - c. Satisfactory completion of English courses at an accredited university or college within the United States.

Bank account statements, letters, and/or other forms of documentation, which will support the promise given above, must be included with this application.

Housing is not available for spring applicants.

If you do not require on-campus housing, please be aware that the college is not serviced by public transportation. Options for commuting to campus are limited. If you plan to live with relatives in the area, you must be sure to have reliable transportation to and from the college.

Undergraduate students with less than required TOEFL or insufficient English proficiency may still be admitted into a BS degree program if they are willing to do ESL first.

Financial Requirements

- International students must submit evidence of sufficient financial resources for living and educational expenses. Support documents must be dated within the last six months. Proof of financial support can be in one of the following forms:
  - A letter of sponsorship or scholarship from a government agency or corporation. This letter of sponsorship must be an original and outline specific billing procedures.
  - b. Complete the following Declaration and Certification of Finances form. This form must be accompanied by supporting bank statements or employment verification. Include signatures or original letters of support from each sponsor.
- Students who have not provided valid evidence of sponsorship from a government agency or corporation must make a tuition deposit of \$500 prior to formal acceptance and issuance of I-20.

Applicants may expect an answer from the college three to five weeks after receipt of all necessary documents. All international students must join the college health insurance program, unless adequate coverage is proven.
