CAPITOL TECHNOLOGY UNIVERSITY INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

FIRST-YEAR AND TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students who apply to Capitol Technology University for admission as a first-year or transfer student will automatically have their applications reviewed for one of the institutional scholarship programs. Students whose cumulative grade point average and SAT scores fit into the Merit Scholarship Grid will automatically receive a scholarship. They will be notified by the Office of Admissions of their award amount.

CONTINUING STUDENTS WHO MEET THE CRITERIA WILL BE NOTIFIED EARLY SPRING.

All of the scholarships are annually renewable to recipients who maintain at least a 3.0 grade point average and complete 24 credits each year. Students renewing the Richard A. Wainwright Grant are to maintain at least a 2.0 GPA and a 2.5 GPA for the Emerging Leaders Scholarship.

Board of Trustees Scholarship

Awards range from \$4,000 to \$6,000. The scholarship is named to recognize the service and support of the college's Board of Trustees members.

Capitol Scholars Program

The Capitol Scholars Program is designed for remarkable students who have the ability to excel in the fields of engineering, information technology, and computer science. Your talent for technology and ambitious goals and drive

could be the characteristics that earn you a spot as one of five students selected each year to be Capitol Scholars.

Capitol Scholars receive a full scholarship and the opportunity to participate in a prestigious four-year program that is challenging, integrated, and hands-on. The program offers students an encouraging support system, dedicated mentors, and above all, career planning assistance and internship opportunities.

REQUIREMENTS

- •a 3.0 GPA or higher
- •a combined SAT CR/M score of 1100 or higher or the ACT equivalent

How to Apply

- 1. Apply to the college and be accepted
- 2. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Results must be sent to the CAPITOL TECHNOLOGY UNIVERSITY Office of Financial Aid two weeks prior to interviews.
- 3. Nominated students are invited to a CSP Interview and Presentation Day to present their academic interests. Students may consult with an admissions representative for interview preparation.

DEADLINE:

March 1 – Deadline for applications and FAFSA forms February and March – Interview and Presentation Days April 1 – Notification of awards

Emerging Leaders Program

This scholarship entails a comprehensive program that will strengthen their academic skills, enhance their bond with fellow classmates and provide them with opportunities to meet with business and industry leaders through our innovation and leaders.



Capitol Technology University offers a \$5,000 scholarship to FIRST Robotics students. These funds may be used toward any undergraduate course of study at the college and the award is renewable up to a total of \$20,000 over four years, contingent upon good academic standing.

REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for this scholarship you must:

- •Be a senior in high school
- •Have participated in at least one full season during your junior or senior year on a FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC) team or a FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC) team; and
- •Apply and be admitted to Capitol Technology University as a full-time student.

Presidential Scholarship

Awards range from \$7,000 to \$9,000.

Richard J. Heiman Scholarship

This scholarship is named in honor of a dedicated member of the Capitol Technology University Board of Trustees. This is the largest of the institutional scholarships. Awards range from \$10,000 to \$12,000. Eligible Heiman scholarship awardees are invited to our Capitol Scholars program in January to compete for additional scholarships up to full tuition.

Richard A. Wainwright Grant

This grant provides support for students who have academic ability and demonstrate financial need. The Richard A. Wainwright Grant is the highest level of institutional grant offered to the most qualified students.

Wainwright Scholarship

Named in honor of Capitol's first Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Dick Wainwright. Awards range from \$1,000 to \$3,000. Eligible applicants will have at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA and a combined SAT CR/M of at least 900.

CORPORATE, ENDOWED & FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Acterna Scholarship Fund (JDSU)

This scholarship was established in 1997 as part of the Millennium Society Scholarship Fund. Acterna, formerly Telecommunications Techniques Corporation, supports one outstanding third- or fourth-year student. In addition, the scholar will exhibit financial need, exemplary character, initiative and leadership potential.

Alcatel USA Scholarship

An endowment by DSC Communications Corporation, now Alcatel USA, was established in 1984 to help academically talented, financially needy students. Since that time, it has provided two scholarships each academic year.

Avrum Gudelsky Memorial Scholarship

Funds for this scholarship have been made available through an endowment created by Homer and Martha Gudelsky in memory of their son, Avrum. This scholarship recognizes and encourages academic excellence among outstanding seniors who are pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree. It is the highest academic honor the college confers.

Carl and Sandra English Endowed Scholarship Fund

This award provides support to African American students who have outstanding academic ability and financial need. One scholarship is awarded each year. The English family has been involved at the college for many years and has a long history of supporting the college's mission.

Charles and Helen DeVore Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was endowed in memory of Charles and Helen DeVore. The scholarship provides financial support to two students with junior or senior status who have been active in the Capitol Technology University student branch of the IEEE (a professional engineering association) who have demonstrated abilities in communication and maintained a high standard of academics. The endowment has grown significantly throughout the years and funds one scholarship for each academic year.

Frederick J. Berger Scholarship

Dr. Frederick J. Berger, executive director of the Tau Alpha Pi National Honor Society, has endowed this award to recognize outstanding scholarship in engineering technology. Qualifications include membership in Tau Alpha Pi National Honor Society, demonstrated leadership and fine character.

George I. Alden Trust Scholarship

A continued supporter of Capitol Technology University, the George I. Alden Trust provided an endowed scholarship to the Millennium Society Scholarship Fund. The scholarship was established in 1998.

Homer Gudelsky Memorial Award

This scholarship program has been designated to provide encouragement and support for an outstanding freshman with demonstrated commitment and potential for academic success. Faculty members nominate and select the recipient.

John & Beverly Puente Scholarship \$3,500

Leonard Jarrell Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of Leonard Jarrell. The Jarrell family has been part of the Capitol Technology University community for more than 27 years. Leonard, an engineer and teacher, played an important role in building a relationship between IEEE and the college. This scholarship is part of the Millennium Society Scholarship Fund and is dedicated to the support of future generations of engineers and technologists.

LTC Lawrence Sites Scholarship

One scholarship is awarded each academic year in the amount of \$2500.

Micro Systems Scholarship \$2,900

The Brigadier General Harold R. "Johnny" Johnson and Maria Baciu Johnson Scholarship

This scholarship was endowed by the Johnson family and William O. Hider, in memory of Brigadier General Harold R. –Johnny Johnson and his wife, Maria Baciu Johnson. The Brigadier General was the fifth president of Capitol Technology University. This scholarship is for a junior with a career in innovation, entrepreneurship or business.

France-Merrick Foundations Scholarship

This endowed scholarship, made possible by a grant from the France-Merrick Foundations, enables Capitol Technology University to provide support to students with outstanding academic ability. One award is made each year. The France-Merrick Foundations actively support many cultural and educational initiatives in the Baltimore area. The France-Merrick Foundations Endowed Scholarship Fund for Baltimore City Residents. The France-Merrick Foundations have established a fund to provide a scholarship for a financially needy student who is a resident of Baltimore City. One award is made each year.

The Giannopoulos Fund

Tom Giannopoulos, president of Micros Systems, Inc., is a former member of the Capitol Technology University Board of Trustees. He generously provided funding to establish the Giannopoulos Fund to support bright students pursuing high-technology degrees at Capitol Technology University.

Thomas Capshaw Memorial Scholarship

The family of Thomas E.Capshaw has created the Thomas Capshaw Memorial Scholarship to remember the late alumnus of the Capitol Radio Engineering Institute (CREI), now known as Capitol Technology University. Each year, the scholarship will be awarded to an undergraduate student who is majoring in either electronics engineering technology or astronautical engineering, and who demonstrates financial need. The scholarship will be awarded to one student annually in the fall semester with a fall and spring disbursement. Special consideration will be given to students from either North Carolina or Florida (former residences of Capshaw).

Walter and Annie Pike Scholarship

Anne Pike, widow of Walter Pike, has very generously established an endowment in memory of her late husband, He received a diploma from Capitol Radio & Engineering Institute (CREI), the predecessor institute of Capitol Technology University. In 1939, based on his CREI education, Pike was declared vital to the war effort during WW II and developed radar and other state-of- the-art systems. He had a long distinguished career in government.

William Randolph Hearst Endowed Scholarship Fund for Women

The Hearst Foundation established this program in 1988. Its purpose is to encourage women to enter the field of engineering. The endowment has grown from one scholarship per year to four.

William Randolph Hearst Endowed Scholarship Fund for Women and Minorities

The Hearst Foundation affirmed its support for Capitol Technology University by joining the Millennium Society in 2000. Its scholarship fund is to encourage women and minority students to enter the field of engineering.

MARYLAND STATE SCHOLARSHIPS/GRANTS

Howard P. Rawlings Program of Educational Excellence Awards

HOWARD P. RAWLINGS GUARANTEED ACCESS (GA) GRANT

REQUIREMENTS: Current high school seniors who will complete a college preparatory program or a student who graduated prior to the current academic year who provides written documentation explaining why they were unable to attend college within one (1) year of graduating from high school.

You and your parents (if you are a dependent student) must be Maryland residents. You must enroll at a two-year or four-year Maryland college or university as a full-time (12+ credits per semester; audited courses cannot be used to reach the minimum credit hours required for full-time status), degree-seeking, undergraduate student, and you must demonstrate financial need. All applicants must have a minimum, unweighted cumulative 2.5 high school grade point average (GPA) and meet the following income requirements:

HOWARD P. RAWLINGS EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE (EA) GRANT

REQUIREMENTS: Current high school seniors and full-time, degree-seeking undergraduates. You and your parents (if you are a dependent student) must be Maryland residents. You must enroll at a two-year or four-year Maryland college or university as a full-time (12+ credits per semester), degree seeking, undergraduate student. Audited courses cannot be used to reach the minimum credit hours required for full-time status. You must demonstrate financial need. All applicants are ranked by Expected Family Contribution (EFC). Your EFC is based on information reported on the FAFSA. Students with the lowest EFC are awarded first.

DEADLINE: March 1st

PART-TIME GRANT

REQUIREMENTS: Part-time, degree-seeking undergraduates and students dually enrolled in a Maryland high school and an institution of higher education.

The minimum award is \$200, and the maximum award is \$2,000. Funds may not be available to award all eligible students.

DEADLINE: March 1st

Legislative Scholarships

Delegate Scholarships

REQUIREMENTS: Current high school seniors and full-time or part-time, degree-seeking undergraduate and graduate students. Students attending a private career school may also apply.

How to apply: If your delegates make their own awards, you should call or write them for further instructions. The Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) can provide a list of all State legislators. Some delegates ask OSFA to make awards for them. These awards are made on the basis of need as demonstrated on the FAFSA. If a delegate asks OSFA to make the awards, students must complete and file the FAFSA.

When to apply: Complete and file the FAFSA by March 1. Contact your delegates in February for further instructions

Eligible majors: All majors are eligible. The minimum annual award is \$200. You may hold the Delegate Scholarship with all State awards. The total dollar amount of all State scholarship awards may not exceed your cost of attendance as determined by your college's financial aid office or \$19,000, whichever is less. Funds may not be available to award all eligible students

SENATORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Who may apply: Current high school seniors and full-time and part-time, degree-seeking undergraduate and graduate students. Students attending a private career school may also apply.

How to apply: Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). If your senator makes his/her own awards, you must call or write to your legislator for further instructions. The Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) can provide a list of all State legislators.

When to apply: Complete and file the FAFSA at www.fafsa.gov by March 1. Contact your senator in February for further instructions.

Eligible majors: All majors are eligible.

You may use this scholarship at an out-of-state school if your major is not available at any Maryland institution and if your senator agrees. In order to verify your major as unique, you must complete the Unique Major Application and submit it to MHEC with the required documentation. Allow 8 weeks for processing

District of Columbia Education Assistance

District of Columbia Tuition Assistance Program (DCTAG)

Requirements: You must be a DC resident and complete a FAFSA. Applications are available February 1 and must be submitted before the June 30 deadline. You must complete the DC OneApp yearly and provide the DC OneApp required supporting documents at the same time. The website is https://dconeapp.dc.gov/

Mayor's Scholars

Requirements: You must be a graduate of a public high school in the District of Columbia (including DCPS and public charters). You must have lived in the District of Columbia for the past twelve months. Eligibility is based on financial need. The website is http://osse.dc.gov/mayorsscholars.

DC-Cap Last Dollar Award

Requirements: You must be a graduate of a DC Public High School or public charter high school. You must complete the FAFSA, DC-Tag Application and DC-Cap Authorization Form. The website is http://www.dccap.org/hs-students/last-dollar-award.

PRIVATE SCHOLARSHIPS

ABC Humane Wildlife Control & Prevention, Inc.'s Academic Scholarship

To apply: Write an essay about why you are passionate about science, technology, engineering, or math, and how will your pursuit of these fields help preserve biodiversity, improve the health of our planet, or alleviate human suffering. Please send your essay response in 1000 words or fewer to **grants@abcwildlife.com**. The subject line of your submission must include "Women in STEM Scholarship." You do not need to be a United States citizen to apply. This scholarship is open to persons who identify as female. Graduate and undergraduate students enrolling or continuing in STEM fields of study at accredited universities are welcome to apply by the **July 1, 2020.**

AFCEA Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Major Scholarships for Undergraduate Students

STEM Major Scholarship Eligibility:

Undergraduate candidates must be at least second-year college students enrolled as **sophomores or juniors full-time in a four-year college or university** at the time of application. Expected graduation date cannot be in the year the scholarship is awarded.

You are NOT eligible to apply:

- 1. If attending a Community College and planning to attend a four-year university
- 2. If attending a two-year college
- 3. If you are a freshman or a senior in a four-year university
- 4. If you are a high school senior

A current overall **GPA of 3.0 or higher** in their current program at an accredited U.S. college or university required at the time of application.

Applicants must be U.S. Citizens or Permanent Residents.

Applications will be accepted from current eligible undergraduate level students majoring in STEM fields that meet the mission of AFCEA, to include Cyber Security, Intelligence and Homeland Security-related disciplines. Online programs are eligible.

Qualifying STEM majors related to the mission of AFCEA include: Biometry/Biometrics, Computer Engineering, Computer Forensics Science, Computer Programming, Computer Science, Computer Systems, Cybersecurity, Electrical Engineering, Electronics Engineering, Geospatial Science, Information Science, Information Technology, Information Resource Management, Intelligence, Mathematics, Network Engineering, Network Security, Operations, Research, Physics, Robotics Engineering, Robotics Technology, Statistics, Strategic Intelligence, and Telecommunications Engineering

Undergraduate Diversity Scholarship

Applicants for the Undergraduate Diversity Scholarship must meet all of the eligibility requirements of the STEM Majors Scholarship. Additionally, applicants must be a woman or minority student. Students attending HBCUs are particularly encouraged to apply. Graduate students should apply to the

Ralph W. Shrader Graduate Diversity Scholarship.

Cyber Security Scholarship

Applicants for the Cyber Security Scholarship must meet all of the eligibility requirements of the STEM Majors Scholarship. Additionally, applicants must be in one of the following majors:

Blue Ribbon Scholarship

A current master's degree student who has successfully completed three master's level courses with a 3.0 CGPA may receive a tuition scholarship of \$500 per course for the next three consecutive courses. A student may renew the scholarship during their ninth course.

To qualify:

- Successfully pass three master's level courses with a 3.0 CGPA;
- Complete the Blue Ribbon Scholarship application during enrollment in the third master's course:
- Continue enrollment in each consecutive term (3 credits per term) or semester (6 credits); and
- Maintain 3.0 CGPA.

Once Financial Aid has confirmed eligibility, the Blue Ribbon Scholarship will be awarded in the subsequent terms/semesters. During the second week of the term/semester, eligibility will be reviewed and the scholarship will be applied to the student account. Adjustments may be required based on enrollment. Failure to enroll in each consecutive term/semester while receiving the scholarship will terminate any undisbursed funds. After receiving \$1500 the student may reapply for the Blue Ribbon Scholarship upon completion of an additional three master's courses and meeting all other eligibility requirements.

Blue Ribbon Referral

An alumni or current student in a master's degree at Capitol Technology University who refers a student to any of the university's degree programs – undergraduate, master's or doctorial, will receive a full course tuition for *each student referred*.
