## Visual Design Tips:

1. **Font Size:** Keep title fonts large (50-60pt), section headers (30-40pt), and body text readable (18-24pt).
2. **Images & Graphics:** Use high-quality images and diagrams, and make sure they are large enough to see from a distance.
3. **Color Scheme:** Use a professional color scheme that doesn't distract from the content.
4. **Spacing & Layout:** Organize content in sections with clear headers. Leave enough whitespace to avoid clutter.
